These options are in the *Microsoft Teams Admin Center > Meetings > Meeting Policies > Meeting join & lobby* section.

Note: When using \$true or \$false in PowerShell, you can think of \$true as meaning "on" and \$false as meaning "off."

Anonymous users can join a meeting

```
Set-CsTeamsMeetingPolicy -Identity "MyCustomPolicy"
-AllowAnonymousUsersToJoinMeeting $true
```

Anonymous users and dial-in callers can start a meeting

```
Set-CsTeamsMeetingPolicy -Identity "MyCustomPolicy"
-AllowAnonymousUsersToStartMeeting $true
```

Who can bypass the lobby

```
Set-CsTeamsMeetingPolicy -Identity "MyCustomPolicy" -AutoAdmittedUsers
Everyone
```

Microsoft Team Admin Center option	PowerShell
Everyone	Everyone
People in my org and guests	EveryoneInCompany
People in my org, trusted orgs, and guest	EveryoneInSameAndFederatedCompany
People in my org	EveryoneInCompanyExcludingGuests
Only organizers and co-organizers	OrganizerOnly
People who were invited	InvitedUsers

People dialing in can bypass the lobby

```
Set-CsTeamsMeetingPolicy -Identity "MyCustomPolicy"
-AllowPSTNUsersToBypassLobby $true
```

People can join external meetings hosted by

```
Set-CsTeamsMeetingPolicy -Identity "MyCustomPolicy" -ExternalMeetingJoin  
EnabledForAnyone
```

Anyone	EnabledForAnyone
Only people in trusted orgs	EnabledForTrustedOrgs
No one	Disabled
