What is Multi Factor Authentication?

- Something you know (Password, pin number, etc..)
- Something you have (Smartcard, key fob, cell phone)
 - Something you are (Biometrics)


Strengthening Identities with Two-Step Verification

- No single step of authentication is strong enough to stand on it's own in todays cyber security climate
- Two step verification significantly increases security by adding an additional layer of protection
