1. It is important to re-assess the environment during the Assess phase to identify any changes, such as the presence of new security controls. 

Environments often change and it is important to re-assess the environment for new security controls, for example, to discern if the planned course of action is still a viable plan.

2. Acclimating to the presence of new security cameras in the environment involves deciding how they impact my mission goals. How will I bypass these new cameras and does it agree with the current RoE? Additionally, I must consider how it may hinder my fellow operators from reaching their goals as well. 

Acclimating to changes in the environment has the potential to affect my mission goals, other operators' mission goals, the RoE and so on. It is important to consider all factors before adopting a new strategy and moving forward.

3. When I spot a newly discovered security control that was not there during the Recon phase, I should immediately notify my red team leader and my fellow operators. 

Always report changes in the environment to the red team leader for guidance on how to proceed. Additionally, fellow operators should know about it as well.
